

# BIBLICAL AND THEOLOGICAL STUDIES (BBST)

## Biblical Studies Challenge Exams

Challenge exams are designed for those who have a working knowledge of the course content as a result of prior learning (attending a Christian high school, for example), but were not able to transfer that work to Biola. Informal, personal study normally will not prepare one adequately to pass these exams. Exams are available for BBST 209 (3 credits) and BBST 210 (3 credits). These exams may be taken only during the student's first year at Biola. Also, if the student has taken the course (or even a portion of it), the student is not eligible to take the corresponding challenge exam.

Exams are given in two parts, written and oral. Successful performance must be attained on both the written and oral portions in order for the student to receive credit for the challenge exam. Grades are recorded on a credit or no-credit basis only. No re-takes permitted.

A challenge exam is also available for first-year Greek—i.e., BLGR 101 (3 credits) and BLGR 102 (3 credits). See more details under “Greek (<https://catalog.biola.edu/tst/courses/BLGR/>).”

## Courses

### BBST 103 - Biblical Interpretation and Spiritual Formation Credits 3

Equipping to interpret and apply the Bible in accurate and dynamic ways for spiritual transformation and character formation. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies.

**Note(s):** Must be completed during the first year. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

### BBST 165 - Foundations of Christian Thought Credits 3

Introduction to theology with special emphasis on learning to do theology, understand the doctrine of Scripture, introduce the integration of various fields of knowledge with the Bible, and see the importance and development of a Christian worldview. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies.

**Note(s):** Formerly BBST 105; must be completed during the first year.

**Grade Mode:** A.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

### BBST 209 - Old Testament History and Literature Credits 3

An overview of the Old Testament with emphasis on the purpose of the writers; history and culture; literary genre, structure, and themes; persons and events, and practical application for Christian living. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies.

**Note(s):** Formerly BBST 109. **Grade Mode:** A, C.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

### BBST 210 - New Testament History and Literature Credits 3

An overview of the New Testament with emphasis on the purpose of the writers; history and culture; literary genre, structure, and themes; persons and events; and practical application for Christian living. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies.

**Note(s):** Formerly BBST 110. **Grade Mode:** A, C.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

### BBST 220 - Guided Study

**Credits 1-3**

For those needing credits to complete their Bible requirement. Reading with written reports on biblical and/or theological subjects. **Note(s):** May be repeated with different content. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

**Repeat Limit (total number of credits):** 6.

### BBST 251 - Theology I

**Credits 3**

The biblical doctrines of God, Christ, man and sin, with reference to the history and development of Christian theology. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

### BBST 260 - Christian Theology

**Credits 3**

The biblical doctrines of God, Christ, man, sin, salvation, the Holy Spirit, the church and last things with reference to the history and development of Christian theology. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165; Applied Psychology (APSY), Business Management (BMNG), Communication (COMS), Early Childhood (LEEC), Engineering (ENGR), Entertainment Business (CNEN), Interdisciplinary Studies (ITPS), Organizational Leadership (BUOL), Psychology (PPSY), Robotics (ROBO), or Robotics Engineering (ROEN) major, or transfer student with 45 or more approved transferable credits.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

### BBST 306 - Early Christian History - Acts

**Credits 3**

Study of the Book of Acts from a missions perspective, dealing with the activity of the early church and its current expression in evangelism and missions. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165, BBST 210.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

### BBST 310 - Geography of Israel

**Credits 3**

A study of the geography of Israel and its influence upon the history recorded in the biblical text. Because most of the geography-related historical events described in the Bible are found in the Old Testament, there is an Old Testament thrust to the class. Nevertheless, much New Testament material is included, particularly regarding Jerusalem, Galilee, and the area along the Dead Sea. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165, BBST 209.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

### BBST 311 - Biblical Backgrounds

**Credits 3**

Contributions of archeology, geography, culture, and history to biblical interpretation. **Note(s):** May include abroad-study in lands of the biblical world. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165, BBST 209, BBST 210.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Bible, Theology, and Ministry (BBTM), Biblical Ministries (BBMN), or Bible, Theology, and Apologetics (BBTA); and Undergraduate Level.

### BBST 312 - Principles of Interpretation

**Credits 3**

Methods and principles for interpreting Scripture throughout church history and the present era. Theory is applied to texts with an emphasis on the grammatical-historical method. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Bible, Theology, and Ministry (BBTM); and Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 316 - Gospel of John**

Study of the Gospel of John from a missions perspective, dealing with the activity of the life of Jesus and its current expression in evangelism and missions. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165, BBST 210.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

**Credits 3****BBST 320 - Methods of Bible Study**

Essentials of inductive Bible study will be applied to Old and New Testament genres of literature in order to equip the student with skills for observation, interpretation, application and edification. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies.

**Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103.

**Restriction(s):** Must not be Bible, Theology, and Ministry (BBTM); and must be Undergraduate Level.

**Credits 3****BBST 321 - Historical Theology**

Historical survey of people and movements which have shaped the faith of the Christian Church from post-biblical times to the present. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies.

**Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 251, BBST 354.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Bible, Theology, and Ministry (BBTM); and Undergraduate Level.

**Credits 3****BBST 326 - Lukan Writings**

An exegetical examination of the New Testament books of Luke and Acts that focuses on evangelism and missions to encourage the ability to articulate the gospel and to formulate a growing personal vision for missions. This expositional study also encourages students to reflect upon the unity and diversity within the community of the Christian church and to be prepared to interact on behalf of the gospel in a diverse world. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165, BBST 210.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

**Credits 3****BBST 330 - Jesus' Life and Ministry****Credits 3**

This course focuses on Jesus' teachings, ministry actions, and call to discipleship as they are presented in the Synoptic Gospels. Special attention is given to tracing how major themes flow through the Old Testament and find their fulfillment in Jesus. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165, BBST 210.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 336 - Synoptic Gospels****Credits 3**

Study of the Synoptic Gospels from a missions perspective, dealing with the activity of the life of Jesus and its current expression in evangelism and missions. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165, BBST 210.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 340 - Guided Study****Credits 1-3**

In-depth study of a specific book or books of the Bible including written report on the relevance of the book to the student's life. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies.

**Grade Mode:** A.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 341 - Life and Letters of Paul****Credits 3**

Authorship, occasion of writing, themes, theological issues, literary structure and content of Paul's writings set in the context of Paul's life and mission. May focus on a smaller unit such as Prison or Pastoral Letters. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165, BBST 210.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 343 - General Letters****Credits 3**

Authorship, occasion of writing, themes, theological issues, literary structure and content of non-Pauline letters. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165, BBST 210.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 344 - I Corinthians****Credits 3**

An in-depth analysis of Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, emphasizing the historical and cultural background of the letter, its author, and its recipients; the theology of the letter; and the relationship between theology and ethics in Paul's instructions to the church. Focuses particularly on how Paul's ethical method can be appropriated in a twenty-first century context. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165, BBST 210.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 354 - Theology II****Credits 3**

The biblical doctrines of salvation, the Holy Spirit, the church and last things, with reference to the history and development of Christian theology. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Note(s):** Formerly BBST 254. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 360 - Pentateuch****Credits 3**

Mosaic authorship, historical and cultural backdrop, themes, theological issues, literary structure and content. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165, BBST 209.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 365 - Gospel, Kingdom, and Culture****Credits 3**

An exploration of how Christians can have a redemptive, articulate, and transformative presence in contemporary society. Attention is given to how to meaningfully share the gospel (Matt. 28:19), defend a Christian worldview with gentleness and respect (1 Pet. 3:15-16), and think biblically about the major social issues of our age (Romans 12:2). Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies.

**Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165, BBST 209, BBST 210.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 371 - Early History of Israel****Credits 3**

Selected biblical books or topics from the period of the conquest through the establishment of David's kingdom, focusing on historical, cultural and theological issues that aid in interpreting events and texts. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies.

**Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 103, BBST 165, BBST 209.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 4651 - Integration Seminar: Christian Ministries Credits 3**

Senior level capstone seminar in which the student will search the Bible and the literature dealing with the topic(s) under discussion in the course leading to the discovery of means whereby the subject area may be integrated with biblical truth. The Christian Ministries Integration Seminar is especially designed for students in the Bible, Theology and Ministry Major, however scripture indicates that all believers are to be equipped for the work of the ministry (Ephesians 4:11-13), so all ministry-minded students are welcome. The seminar will cover critical topics of current interest and concern to vocational Christian ministers, and particularly for those serving in local and parachurch-based positions. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 209, BBST 210; BBST 251 and BBST 354, or BBST 260; or enrollment as a Torrey Honors College student.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Senior Class; and Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 4652 - Integration Seminar: Christian Philosophy of Education Credits 3**

Senior level capstone seminar in which the student will search the Bible and the literature dealing with the topic(s) under discussion in the course leading to the discovery of means whereby the subject area may be integrated with biblical truth. The results of the research will be incorporated in a paper or project which will be critiqued by the seminar members and by the professor. Students will reflect upon the Bible, educational philosophy, and current educational issues in order to integrate personal Christian beliefs and values with the field of education. Historical educational theories and philosophies will be compared to those of contemporary society and traditional Christian world view(s). Students will engage in developing their own integrated philosophies. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 209, BBST 210; BBST 251 and BBST 354, or BBST 260; or enrollment as a Torrey Honors College student.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Senior Class; Biological Science (BIOS), English (ENGL), History (HIST), Intercultural Studies (INCS), Early Childhood (LECD), Early Childhood (LEEC), Liberal Studies Elementary Ed (LSEE), Liberal Stds Multidisciplinary (LSMD), Mathematics (MATH), Music Education (MUED), Physical Science (PHSC), or Spanish (SPAN); and Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 4653 - Integration Seminar: Christianity and the Natural Sciences Credits 3**

Senior level capstone seminar in which the student will search the Bible and the literature dealing with the topic(s) under discussion in the course leading to the discovery of means whereby the subject area may be integrated with biblical truth. The results of the research will be incorporated in a paper or project which will be critiqued by the seminar members and by the professor. This seminar has three sections: (1) We will look at the history of Christianity and the natural sciences for examples and lessons of their past interaction [which, contrary to myth, has often been favorable]; (2) We will survey the contemporary approaches which various people advocate for the interaction between Christianity and science; (3) We will focus on a specific issue, the Creation Evolution debates, for a detailed look at the contemporary approaches. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 209, BBST 210; BBST 251 and BBST 354, or BBST 260; or enrollment as a Torrey Honors College student.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Senior Class; and Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 4654 - Integration Seminar: Contemporary Art and Theology Credits 3**

Senior level capstone seminar in which the student will search the Bible and the literature dealing with the topic(s) under discussion in the course leading to the discovery of means whereby the subject area may be integrated with biblical truth. Our task in this course is to wrestle with the intersections between art and theology within our contemporary cultural context. What does it look like for an artist or scholar to rigorously engage both Christian theology/practice, on the one hand, and contemporary art theory/practice, on the other? How might the two serve to enrich and deepen each other? What does it look like for a life to be both profoundly theological and profoundly artistic, and for these to form a unified whole? We will attempt to answer these questions through careful reading and writing, coupled with in-class lectures and discussion. We will investigate a range of critical and theological frameworks that offer possibilities for a more meaningful Christian engagement in the contemporary arts. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies.

**Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 209, BBST 210; BBST 251 and BBST 354, or BBST 260; or enrollment as a Torrey Honors College student.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Senior Class; Art (ARTA or ARTT), Design (ADBS), or Studio Art (ARFA); and Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 4655 - Integration Seminar: Contemporary Hispanic Studies Credits 3**

This course is the integration seminar for the Spanish program. It is a senior level capstone seminar in which the student will search the Bible and the literature dealing with the topic(s) under discussion in the course leading to the discovery of means whereby the subject area may be integrated with biblical truth. This course is taught in Spanish. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies.

**Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 209, BBST 210; BBST 251 and BBST 354, or BBST 260; or enrollment as a Torrey Honors College student.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Senior Class; and Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 4656 - Integration Seminar: God and Math Credits 3**

Senior level capstone seminar in which the student will search the Bible and the literature dealing with the topic(s) under discussion in the course leading to the discovery of means whereby the subject area may be integrated with biblical truth. Mathematics is one of the oldest disciplines of academic study and its history has intertwined with theological issues since the ancient Greeks. In this course, we will look at that history and the major philosophical and theological questions which have arisen in relation to math, and their answers. We will also look at how serious math is used in Christian practice today through biblical numerology, apologetics, and practical analogies. Practical analogies are ways of relating mathematical phenomena, such as infinity, dimensionality, and incompleteness, to God. Did God create mathematics or is it a part of His being? Regardless of which side of the issue students land on, they will be challenged to an expanded apprehension of God through the revelation of His nature through abstract mathematics exemplified in the physical world. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies.

**Note(s):** All math majors are strongly encouraged to take the course, as well as students interested in mathematics who have taken one semester of calculus or statistics. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 209, BBST 210; BBST 251 and BBST 354, or BBST 260; or enrollment as a Torrey Honors College student.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Senior Class; and Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 4657 - Integration Seminar: Organizational Ethics Credits 3**

Senior level capstone seminar in which the student will search the Bible and the literature dealing with the topic(s) under discussion in the course leading to the discovery of means whereby the subject area may be integrated with biblical truth. This course focuses on a study of the foundations and theories of ethics as related to the Bible, the marketplace, and the modern corporation. Case studies in modern ethics are discussed with a view to raising the moral consciousness of business professionals. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** Acceptance into the Crowell School of Business; BBST 209, BBST 210; BBST 251 and BBST 354, or BBST 260; or enrollment as a Torrey Honors College student.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Senior Class; and Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 4658 - Integration Seminar: Redeeming Culture Through Music Credits 3**

Senior level capstone seminar in which the student will search the Bible and the literature dealing with the topic(s) under discussion in the course leading to the discovery of means whereby the subject area may be integrated with biblical truth. Music has been described as “one of the most powerful media humans have at their disposal; how it mediates and what it mediates are notoriously hard to understand or explain.” (Begbie, *Resounding Truth*, 14). Like all other parts of creation, music bears the marks of the fall and is tainted by the messages, themes and character of the world. The task of theological integration is the enthroning Christ as King in every sphere of human endeavor and every aspect of the created order. The challenge for the Christian musician is to evaluate our contemporary culture in a theologically discerning way and to express the depth and breadth of God’s truth through the medium of music. In this course, students will learn to look at the contemporary music world, first as artists who evaluate their culture as trained experts in their field of study and, second, as theologians who evaluate their culture and express their faith in a way that resonates with the expressed truth of God’s Word. Students will explore theological themes appropriate to their musical expression and also perform a work that declares God’s truth through their musical expression. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 209, BBST 210; BBST 251 and BBST 354, or BBST 260; or enrollment as a Torrey Honors College student.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Senior Class; Music (MUSC), Music Composition (MUCO), Music Education (MUED or MUEP), Music Performance (MUPR), Music Therapy (MUTP), Worship Arts (MUWA), or Theatre (COTH); and Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 4659 - Integration Seminar: Faith, Philosophy and Science Credits 3**

The Christian worldview provides strong support for the assumptions necessary for scientific inquiry and science as a coherent discipline. Students will be able to articulate these assumptions and the biblical basis for holding them. They will also be able to explain the philosophical underpinnings for the goals, methods and limits to scientific investigation. Additionally, students will argue for the role Christians have to play in current debates within the philosophy of science. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 209, BBST 210; BBST 251 and BBST 354, or BBST 260; or enrollment as a Torrey Honors College student.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Senior Class; Stewart Honors Program; and Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 471 - The Apostolic Fathers**

**Credits 3**

Students will read and discuss the earliest Christian documents composed after the apostolic age, spanning the years A.D. 95-160 (e.g., Aristides, Clement of Rome, Ignatius, Justin Martyr, Papias, Polycarp), with a focus upon compositional purpose, historical setting, theology, and connections with New Testament documents. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 210, BBST 251, BBST 312, BBST 354.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Bible, Theology, and Ministry (BBTM); and Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 475 - Puritan Theology**

**Credits 3**

Traces the history of Protestant spiritual formation from Martin Luther and John Calvin to the English Puritans and acquaints students with the history, theology, and theological influences of relevant theologians. Emphasizes the doctrinal distinctives of the Puritan movement and includes reading primary sources from that era. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies.

**Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 251, BBST 354.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 480 - Directed Research**

**Credits 1-3**

Guided independent reading, research, problem-solving and preparation of a formal paper or project done in consultation with a selected professor. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Note(s):** Students may receive no more than a total of 6 credits counted towards graduation for BBST 480 and BBST 490 combined. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Undergraduate Level.

**Repeat Limit (total number of credits):** 6.

**BBST 481 - New Testament Use of the Old Testament**

**Credits 3**

A consideration of the issues raised by the use of the OT in the NT. Special attention is given to the hermeneutical presuppositions and exegetical methods employed by the NT writers as they appropriate the OT Scriptures, and to the theological implications that arise from their use. Core Curriculum: Approved for Core - Biblical and Theological Studies. **Note(s):** Students who can utilize NT Greek and/or OT Hebrew are especially encouraged to take this course. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Prerequisite(s):** BBST 251, BBST 312, BBST 354.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Bible, Theology, and Ministry (BBTM); and Undergraduate Level.

**BBST 490 - Practicum: Accelerated Bible Programs**

**Credit 1**

Supervised interaction and mentoring as part of ministry preparation while participating in one of Biola's specific accelerated concentrations in the Bible, Theology, and Ministry (BBTM) major. **Grade Mode:** A.

**Restriction(s):** Must be Bible Exposition (BBBE), Biblical and Pastoral Ministry (BBPM), Divinity (BBDV), New Testament (BBNT), Old Testament (BBOT), Pastoral Care and Counseling (BBPC), Philosophy (BBPH), or Theology (BBTH); and Undergraduate Level.

**Repeat Limit (total number of credits):** 3.
